Associated Industries Chief Reviews 2009 Session For NEBA

Wins and losses for private enterprise were outlined for NEBA at its May luncheon by Barney Bishop, president and CEO of Associated Industries of Florida, the state's leading business advocacy organization.

Bishop led off with an attack on the "radical left" that persists in opposing oil/ gas exploration off Florida's coast. Surveys show that over 59 percent of Floridians favor such development to ease the state's financial problems. But a vocal minority continues to block the issue. He did compliment Rep. Michelle Rehwinkle Vasilinda of the Leon County delegation for supporting offshore exploration and "for suffering the slings and arrows" her support attracted.

He said workers compensation was AIF's top priority this session. With its team of 20 lobbyists, AIF won changes in lawyer compensation fees that resulted in \$2.9 billion in fee savings to Florida businesses.

Compromises were necessary

on another priority, maintaining the Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund. While no major financial

savings were attained on this front, AIF was able to block the provision whereby people could receive unemployment compensation even if they left the job voluntarily.

AIF was able to defeat legislation that would have taxed business done outside Florida. Additionally, it fought to keep corporate records with the Secretary of State and away from the Department of Revenue, which sought jurisdiction over such records evidently as a means of boosting corporate tax collections.

Bishop had few kind words for Gov. Charlie Crist, who in AIF's opinion is no friend of the business community.

"We gave him \$200,000 for his campaign because we thought he was a good Republican," Bishop said. "Turns out I'm a better Republican than he is, and I'm a registered Democrat."

He urged the NEBA audience to vote for Crist in his bid for the U.S. Senate because "we want to get him the hell out of Florida." Bishop predicts that Crist in the Senate would vote regularly with Sen. Bill Nelson, whose record for business support is "Zero." Nelson is sponsoring the "card check" bill at would allow unions to organize

that would allow unions to organize any company with 10 or more employees without a secret ballot.

The County Commission recently met to discuss the 2009-2010 budget. Believe it or not, after learning from Leon County Property Appraiser Bert Harstfield that the assessed value throughout the county will be one billion dollars less than last year, they agreed to not increase the millage rate.

This should mean that property taxes on second homes and business property should be reduced. This is the first of many workshops and public hearings, so don't relax your involvement in this issue. Call your County Commissioner and say thank you for

their position.

In addition, the County Commission unanimously voted 7-0 to consolidate the Leon County Growth Management Department with the City of Tallahassee Growth Management Department. We all hope the city will take similar action. Let's call the Mayor and push for this merger.

A closing thought. I was recently moved by this quote by James Freeman Clarke. "A politician thinks of the next election, a statesman, of the next generation." We all need to apply this thought when deciding on our candidates in the next election.

"At Tallahassee Community College, 70% signed cards authorizing an election, yet only 30% voted for the union," Bishop noted. "Under Nelson's bill, TCC would be unionized today simply on the basis of those signed cards."

As in earlier talks, Bishop bemoaned the status of Citizens Insurance, which faces a potential \$485 billion hurricane disaster risk with only \$2.7 billion available, which means it could not cover even one percent of potential losses.

The situation is no better for the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund (CAT fund), which Bishop contends is likewise incapable to covering potential losses.

"Insurance rates in Florida keep going up because losses keep rising," he said. "If we can find some way to mitigate the losses, the rates should come down," he said.
